**Old Business:**

Handyman ad: Emily presents a revised ad, just asking for bids for handyman services. Emily would like to review the ad with MMA.

Town Farm Rd. trees: Brian will cut the trees down, cost around \$600.00, not to exceed \$700.00

Culvert plugging Berry Rd.: The landowner has been notified. State statute allows a fine of \$500/day or 3 days in jail. No final decision has been made. Pot holes continue to be a problem on the Berry Road. Emily will contact Todd to fill the pot holes in.

**New Business:**

Anthony Brillard: Boulter Cemetery, wants chain for entrance. Penny will arrange for this. Fowler Cemetery has 2 pine trees that need to go and one poplar. Pond Cemetery, has a few dead trees, not a hazard, but are an eye sore and should come down. Will assess budget in fall and see about doing it then. Emily will remind Todd to bring in new gravel to Boulter Cemetery.

Charlie Porter: Motion was made to go into executive session pursuant 1 M.R.S.A. § 405(3). Seconded and motion carries. Selectmen move out of executive session. Charlie will apply for an administrative search warrant and will contact Kristin Collins.

Paul Austin: Discusses the revolving renovation grant. The district applied for 22 projects and the state approved to fund 12. He also discussed the budget for the June 13<sup>th</sup> referendum.

Building Permits: All permits may be handed out, they are to return the completed application to the town office, collect the fee and then submit to Charlie Porter. No application will be considered until the fee has been collected and a permit number is issued.

Update on failed septic issue: David Schofield updates the selectmen about the failed septic system. Selectmen review letter from the plumbing inspector to the land owner and discuss an action plan. The land owner knows the letter is coming.

Crosby Brook Rd: Water is collecting, no base coat and frost heaves. On side of the road is cracked and the other is not. All repairs are under the contractor's contract. Emily is going to consult with Allstate.

Sidewalk estimates: Penny reviewed the estimates:

Wellman's-- \$18,404.50

Hopkins --- \$16,150

Bard -- \$38,600

Penny is going to contact Hopkins before making a final decision.

Quitclaim Deed: Selectmen sign three quitclaim deeds.

Liquor License: Selectmen sign Liquor License.

RSU #3 Referendum: Warrants are signed by the Selectmen.

**Other Business:**

Emily is adding \$20 to the warrant payable to RSU #3 adult education for ATV safety training for the fire department.

Tony is working on getting prices for cheaper pedestrian signs, quotes on the ground work for the shed and a representative for the recycle center.
