Selectmen's Meeting
June 20 , 2017

Opening:

Meeting opened at 6:35p.m.

People present were:

Selectmen: Penny S., Tony A., Emily Newell

Public Feedback: Jason Johnson would like to have ATV access to a few town roads, The trails they are asking permission for are, Crosby Brook Rd, Ward Hill Rd, and Fisher Rd. The ATV club will seek alternative routes and land owner permission to try to get off the roads as much as possible. Selectmen authorize ATV access on the Crosby Brook Rd, Ward Hill Rd and Fisher Rd.

Charlie Porter would like to know how to proceed with the shoreland zoning violation. Need to meet with the Landowner and should the lawyer get involved? Three trees were planted, however that is not enough. There should be 2 replacement trees for each chopped tree and must be 4ft high and 2" around. Charlie wants a meeting with the landowner to sign a consent agreement or the State needs to get involved. Kari will contact the landowner to set up a meeting

Treasurer:

Selectmen reviewed and signed the warrants.

KVCOG dues come from TIF, not taxation and a bill from the Town's Lawyer for EDC RFP review should have come out of TIF. Kari will research this and make the proper changes.

Old Business:

EDC: The EDC rejected all bids due to the lack of approval from the selectboard.

New Business:

Volunteer Appreciation: Penny would like to have a social event for all volunteers/committee members. Emily suggested writing an elegant letter and posting it. Penny will write a letter.

Recycle Drawing Contest: Selectmen reviewed the submissions of the recycle drawing contest. Aubrey Bosco is the winner and Riley Bosco is the runner up!

Unity College: The College owns the triangle piece on the corner of Depot street. The property once belonged to historical society, as was tax exempt, now it is in the hands of the college, currently is it tax exempt, but it should be a taxable lot. Selectmen will bring this to the assessor attention to have it become a taxable lot. It is possible that sending the tax bill may open the door to see if they college would give it to the town?

Other Business:

There was a fishing tournament held at Kanokolus. The company that hosted the tournament paid a \$50 fee to the State of Maine. However the money is not sent to the Town. Penny is going to look into this.

Penny is going to reach out to the Friends of Lake Winnecook about getting a second boat inspector as a fill in.

Tony asked if someone could put a hamburger/hot dog stand (a mobile unit) down near the lake. Selectmen approve as long as it is a mobile unit and not stationary.
