Opening:

Old Business:

Alicia McCormick will be stepping down from the Budget Committee

Estimated time frame when the Bailey Road will be done? Dan will follow up with Cindy.

When the grading in Monroe is completed he will come to Unity. Weather is playing a larger factor currently.

New Business:

Signing of the Resolution is tabled until the next meeting with the Fire Chief.

Ladies Auxiliary will be having an ATV Poker Run August 17. It will start at the Fire Station. The trail will have 5 stops with cards at each stop. The best hand wins. Selectmen must sign the Game of Chance from the State of Maine. They will also seek permission from the State of Maine for temporary access on the roads for ATVs. Selectmen asked that a copy of the waiver be placed on file at the Town Office.

Ladies Auxiliary's regular meeting are the 2nd Wednesday at 6:30pm at the Fire Station.

Kari Hulva was here to provide information about Farmdrop, they were awarded a Marketing Grant for \$900 and a Community Grant for \$2500. Selectmen authorize to add the checks to the warrant. Selectmen set conditions: Any equipment purchased: e.g: chest freezer, metal shelving must return ownership to the Town of Unity. Anyone can sign up and is open to all Farmers in Unity.

Penny will see if the State wants the old boat dock back, if not, try to sell it, if no interest, see if the ATV club wants it for bridges.

A resident asked if they could use the Horse Ring. The Selectmen agreed it would be a \$100 refundable deposit, must sign a waiver, has yearly access and only for her use. No other horses will be permitted. For non residents, it is a \$125 fee with \$100 refundable.

Dustin Hodgdon was caught at Kanokolus spinning tires and making donuts with his truck. The Waldo County Sheriff was contacted. Selectmen agreed we may not trespass at Kanokolus.

Selectmen adopt and sign the Junkyard and Nuisance laws. This will be enforced by Charlie Porter.

Elwell Farm Road and Quaker Hill Road will have ATV access.

Someone asked if the town could order a blind drive for Crowell Road. Selectmen authorize the purchase of the sign.

Selectmen review the roadside mowing bids. Sandra Greeley bid for the season is \$3600 and Fredrick Drew's bid for the season is 3307.50. Selectmen will go with Frederick Drew.

Waning Road town sign is gone.

Flowers for the town office what do we want to do? It will cost roughly \$250 - \$300. Do it this year, then next year get ½ barrels and plant flowers for the town office. It will save money in the long run.
