## Selectmen's Meeting

### September 17, 2019

#### **Opening:**

Meeting opened at 6:30pm.

**Minutes:** Minutes from the September 20th were reviewed and accepted.

**Guest Speaker:** Michael Carroll, Executive Director of Municipal Review Committee discusses the progress of Fiberright. At this time Fiberright must pass an acceptance test. It will be mid to late October before it is open to everyone. They will not be able to take tires, tarps, mattresses and boat wrap. Discussed options to dispose of tires and ways to help residents, no decision was made.

Road Signs. Michael will finish what he has, jobs are not getting done in a timely fashion, but if the Selectmen are okay with that, he will continue. Selectmen are fine with it, it's hard to find someone to do the work.

The stone in Village Cemetery will be removed. Mike will take care of it the next day. Town will hold onto the stone for now.

Penny will set up a Cemetery Committee Meeting.

Selectmen signed a Liquor License for Unity College.

New power broom was purchased. It was cheaper to buy new than repair the old one.

Aggressive Cuts, LLC is purchasing equipment to cut brush and small trees. It is \$1,000/mile with a 3 mile minimum. Something to budget for next year.

Mary Leaming is coordinating UBR day of Service. Penny would like to purchase D/2 to clean some cemetery stones.

Selectmen authorized the purchase of D/2 cleaner.
