October 30, 2018

Opening:

Meeting opened at 6:30pm.

Minutes: Minutes from October 16th were reviewed.

Public Feedback: None

Fire Department:

- Rescue 5 had to be serviced. Approximately \$3000 worth of work at Alliance and still needs additional work, they are waiting on a part which is another \$800.00.
- New turnout gear is starting to come in.
- Recruited a couple new potential members.
- Members are passing their training. However to stay compliant, more training will need to be done next year.
- Fire Department has been getting called out to help Delta with a person in a wheelchair. It happens 2 to 3 times a day. Delta is only sending one person, calling Waldo County dispatch as an emergency (which the situation, is not an emergency) and members have been responding to it. This ties up a couple of the members from major emergencies. How should the Fire Department handle future calls. Penny will talk with Jeff Trafton. Pat Haley will talk with the head of Delta. Fire Department will continue to help until a plan is put in place.
- Fire Department has around 16 students in the Explorer Program that meet on Monday nights.
- Terry Shorey has not contacted any of the Selectmen to let them know the job at the Fire Station is finished.
- The Fire Department is 100% compliant with State requirements and have responded to 120 so far this year.

Treasurer:

- Foreclosure will occur November 1st.
- Selectmen authorize Kari to add \$50 on the warrant for the Woodsmen Team as a donation.
- Warrants were signed and reviewed.

Old Business:

- Toby will grade roads. Including, Clark, Kanokolus, Newell and South Waning.
- Need a list of Park and Rec Committee members.
- Dan will plow the town office until someone is found.

- Tony wanted to know if we shop around for salt for the roads. Town use KVCOG for Salt bids. It was awarded to Morton Salt at \$52.25/ton delivered.

New Business:

- Brian Gaudet is stepping down as Unity's UARRC representative, but will be an Alternative. Elizabeth Soucie will step in as Unity's UARRC rep and Diane Hauser will act as an alternate.
- November 19th, Selectmen will meet with DOT to discuss sidewalks and paving that will occur next year.
- The winter parking ban will go into effect November 1st.
- Penny made a motion to go into executive session pursuant 22 M.R.S.A. § 4306. Dan seconded, motion carried. Motion to end executive session, seconded and carried.
- Selectmen sign the Emergency Operations Plan.
